

THIS WAS THE SUMMER TO FALL IN LOVE WITH LAKE CHAMPLAIN!

With over 80 days of 80-degree weather, playing and learning on the waterfront was a hallmark of the 2012 season. Thousands of youth and adults flocked to the shores of Lake Champlain and spent over **35,000 hours** on **95 boats,** dipping their toes in the water while watching in awe as their sails filled with warm breeze. With Lake Champlain literally at our doorstep, we're able to orchestrate countless opportunities to spark "aha!" moments that are essential for young people to truly understand themselves and the world around them. **1,512 youth and adults** participated in our education and training programs this summer, for a total of 5,296 programming hours. That is **5,296 hours** spent rigging boats, working with a team, learning about how pollution affects watersheds, building confidence, and relishing experiences that highlight personal – and sometimes surprising – strengths, passions, and abilities inside each student.

Our education and training programs provide a unique approach to immersive education that uses the waters and shores of Lake Champlain and the sport of sailing to create strong ties between learning and the lake.

ADAPTIVE WATERSPORTS PROGRAM

Few things in life compare to sailing for its therapeutic benefits, uplifting and rejuvenating the spirit. It builds confidence and self esteem, while challenging the whole person.

This summer the Adaptive Watersports Program, in partnership with Vermont Adaptive Ski & Sports, created opportunities for over **400 students with disabilities** to use the Sailing Center as a gateway to the water...leaving their dependence on the dock.

CUSTOM PROGRAMS

This summer we offered customized programs for over **2,108 participants,** including a special day for seniors through a new partnership with AARP Vermont. We welcomed over **300 AARP members** to the waterfront for kayaking, paddleboarding clinics, keelboat rides, and much more. One 86-year-old woman who had lived in Chittenden County her whole life took her very first sailing trip during the AARP day on the lake!


